## 1. Resolution 2012-102 - Acceptance of the proposed agenda

## 2. Resolution 2012-103- Acceptance of the minutes of regular meeting of November 10, 2012

**Considering that** a copy of the Minutes was given to each member of the Town Council not less than twenty-four hours before the present council, this conforming to Article 333 of the Cities and Towns Act,

### 3. Current Affairs

## 3.1. Announcements

Mayor Luc Trépanier announced the death of Marcel Laviolette, Barkmere resident and father of Adele Laviolette, and offers condolences to the family members.

A meeting was held with the management infrastructure department of the Ministry of Municipal affairs to know the possibilities to obtain the grant for the dam. A waiver could be possible, however it must go all the way up to the federal government. So this is a long and difficult process. Another option is to consider the risks to provincial roads, including highways 327 and 364, if the dam had were to break. If such risks exist, it could make the project eligible.

Councillor Stephen Lloyd mentioned the improvements to the Community Centre and thanked Mr. Bellerose for adding photos.

## 4.3 Resolution 2012-105 - Schedule of meetings for 2013

## 4.4 Resolution 2012-106 - Pro Mayor

**Considering that** the Town of Barkmere must ensure its functioning and its representation in case the Mayor would be absent;

**Considering that** article 56 of the Cities and Towns Act (L.R.Q. c.C-19) allows the Town Council to designate a councillor to act as pro-mayor for a fixed period;

**Considering that** the mandate of Councillor Bruce MacNab as Pro-Mayor of the Town of Barkmere ended on December 8, 2012;

**Therefore**, Councillor Marc Fredette moved, Councillor Jean Dubois seconded, and it was unanimously resolved by all present:

**That** Councillor Stephen Lloyd be designated as Pro-Mayor of the Town of Barkmere for the period starting December 9 2012 and ending June 8 2013 inclusively.

## 5. <u>Urbanism</u>

## 5.1. Resolution 2012-107- Contract for professional services - Urbanists

**Considering** the need to review and to make regulatory changes relating to:

- -telecommunications towers;
- -areas at risk of landslide
- -boathouses
- -flotation materials for docks and boathouses;

**Considering** sections 573.1 and 573.3.0.2 of the Cities and Towns Act (L.R.Q. c. C-19) and the Regulation respecting the awarding of contracts for certain professional services;

**Therefore**, Councillor Stephen Lloyd moved, Councillor Marc Fredette seconded, and it was unanimously resolved by all present:

**That** the Town of Barkmere mandate the firm Urba+, to prepare appropriate draft bylaws for the above mentioned subjects;

That the fees do not exceed \$5,000, taxes not included.

## 6. Public services

#### 6.1. Security and protection

## 6.1.1. <u>Resolution 2012 - 108 - Amendment to the intermunicipal agreement on fire protection and for the provision of service</u>

**Considering** the intermunicipal agreement on protection against fire and for the provision of service, signed between the municipalities of Montcalm, of Arundel, Huberdeau and the Town of Barkmere;

**Whereas** the method of distribution of financial contributions was determined for the years 2011 and 2012 on the basis of a budgeted amount of \$ 130,000 and no specifications have been established for subsequent years.

**Therefore**, Councillor Laurent Barbé moved, Councillor Stephen Lloyd seconded, and it was unanimously resolved by all present:

**That** the Town of Barkmere amend the intermunicipal agreement of fire protection and for the provision of service, done with the municipalities of Montcalm, Arundel and Huberdeau, as follows:

Article 4 "FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS OF MUNICIPALITIES" is amended by adding after the second paragraph the following paragraph:

"In subsequent years, 2013 and following the budgeted amount used as basis will be established by the intermunicipal committee. This budget must be approved by a resolution of each of the councils, which will be adopted in November of each year and transmitted a copy to each of the participating municipalities in the agreement."

## 6.1.2. Resolution 2012- 109 - Endorsement of the purchase of a service truck for the fire brigade

**Considering** the intermunicipal agreement on protection against fire and for the provision of service, signed between the municipalities of Montcalm, of Arundel, Huberdeau and the Town of Barkmere;

**Considering** the need for the municipality of Huberdeau to replace the service truck of it's fire brigade;

**Whereas** the Municipality of Huberdeau purchased a new Silverado 2500HD 2003 truck, serial number 1gchk29u53e310988, for the amount of \$ 14,371.88;

Whereas the funds for this expenditure were taken from its accumulated surplus;

**Therefore**, Councillor Jean Dubois moved, Councillor Laurent Barbé seconded, and it was unanimously resolved by all present:

**That** the Town of Barkmere endorse the purchase of the service truck for the fire brigade of the municipality of Huberdeau.

## **ADOPTED**

## 6.1.3. <u>Resolution 2012- 110 - Amendment of the First Responders service Agreement</u>

**Considering** the intermunicipal agreement on first responders, signed between the municipalities of Montcalm, of Arundel, Huberdeau and the Town of Barkmere;

Whereas the method of distribution of financial contributions was determined for the years 2011 and 2012 on the basis of a budgeted amount of \$ 50,000 and no

specifications have been established for subsequent years.

**Whereas** the proposed acquisition of a truck for the first responders requires an amendment to the agreement with respect to the sharing of funds invested through joint purchasing;

**Therefore**, Councillor Marc Fredette moved, Councillor Jake Chadwick seconded, and it was unanimously resolved by all present:

**That** the Town of Barkmere amend the agreement on first responders, done with the municipalities of Montcalm, Arundel and Huberdeau, as follows:

Article 4 "FINANCIAL CONTRIBUTIONS OF MUNICIPALITIES" is amended by adding after the second paragraph the following paragraph:

"In subsequent years, 2013 and following the budget as a basis will be established by the intermunicipal committee. This budget must be approved by a resolution of each of the councils, which will be adopted in November of each year and transmitted a copy to each of the participating municipalities in the agreement.'

Article 8 SHARING OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES is repealed in its entirety, as well as the title and is replaced by the following:

Article 8 "The joint purchase of buildings, land, vehicles, equipment, requiring amortization, must be approved by resolution by each of the municipalities party to this Agreement";

The addition of a new Article 9 "SHARING OF ASSETS AND LIABILITIES," to read as follows:

"Article 9

- 9.1 Should this agreement end, each municipality will retain full ownership of its land, buildings, vehicles, equipment and accessories, acquired before the conclusion of this agreement.
- 9.2 A municipality wishing to disassociate itself from the Agreement may recover the amount invested since January 1st 2011 through the funding of pumper trucks purchased by the municipality of Montcalm and the municipality of Huberdeau before the conclusion of this agreement. The amount representing the amortization of those trucks will be deducted from these amounts, such amount being calculated for the period from January 1st 2011 to the time of separation;
- 9.3 In the event that there would be complete dissociation of this agreement, the division of funds invested through joint purchases since January 1st 2011 and approved by resolution by each of the municipalities party to this agreement will be the same that the cost sharing of these assets. The amount representing the amortization of such purchases will be deducted from these amounts, such amount being calculated for the period from 1 January 2011 and dissociation."

## 7. Legal affairs

Following the decision recently rendered by the Court of Appeal, Mayor Luc Trépanier recalls the facts of the case which opposed the Town of Barkmere to Ms. Blackwell and Sakkal. The decision of the Court of Appeal reversed the decision of the Superior Court and ordered the town to issue a permit for the construction of a "driveway" of  $\sim 4$  km long. Regulations at the time was simple, there were only standards for width. Mr. Blackwell has submitted its application.

As for the case between the Town and Mr. Grou and Mrs. Michaelsen, stabilization work has been done and the case will be continued in February.

## 8. R.C.M. and government affair

## 8.1. Mayor's report

Mayor Luc Trepanier recounts that at the last council of mayors of the RCM:

-Warden Ronald Provost and Deputy Warden Steven Larose have been renamed in their respective functions until the end of October 2013;

- -Budget: expenditures were reduced by 0.5%, revenues increased by 1.5%, and the share for Barkmere increase of 2.7%.
- -RIDR: With the addition of three new municipalities, the share of Barkmere will be reduced by 18%
- -Ferme du Versant: Following a lawsuit to stop the illegal occupation by a sugar house of Crown land managed by the RCM, it has succeeded;
- -Spending cuts: the RCM will now charge by the piece for some services, including emails for \$ 8 / email / month;
- -Some public intramunicipal lands will be sold by auction, including two in Barkmere. The lands will be first offered to neighbors at the market price.
- -St-Faustin-Lac-Carré calls for the closure of a forest road. We will follow this issue closely.
- -Arundel presents a petition for the amendment of the bylaw for the protection of the linear park, in order to ask the MTQ to recognize the rights of way of some residents over the Aerobic Corridor. The new regulation has the effect of prohibiting passages developed over time but without formal permission.
